Mission Of TNAS

The Triangle Native American Society (TNAS) is a visionary entity empowering American Indian people residing in the Triangle Community to become resilient leaders advocating for educational advancement, economic sufficiency, self-determination and cultural inclusiveness and awareness by capitalizing and building upon the strengths of the community and the infrastructure that promotes and encourages the blending of diverse groups.

Purpose of TNAS

The purpose of the TNAS is to act as the official governing urban Indian organization in the triangle community. Furthermore, the organization seeks to unite American Indians together bridging various unique culture and traditional blends while holistically attending to the needs of the Indian population residing in the community. These will be accomplished by the following:

1. To obtain and administer funds to address the needs of the Indian constituency residing in the triangle community;
2. To provide residents residing in the triangle community information and referral services;
3. To educate, stimulate and cultivate cultural awareness through programming and other forms of media;
4. To promote unity and leadership to achieve political and developmental strength while providing effective advocacy for the American Indian population; and
5. To further strength educational achievement through providing a culturally relevant learning community.

General Information

Previously known as the Mark Ulmer Native American scholarship, Triangle Native American Society has established a scholarship fund that has funded over twenty-five undergraduate students enrolled in UNC system schools across North Carolina.

For the current academic year, a *minimum* of \$500 per scholarship will be awarded before the fall semester or quarter of the following academic calendar, and as many as four scholarships may be awarded. The **application deadline is June 10** of each year. The Scholarship Committee, in conjunction with the Executive Committee of Triangle Native, will review all applications submitted and notify awardees of the scholarship **by the last Saturday in July** via telephone. (*Note: As much as \$1,000 may be awarded to highly exceptional applicants. Prior applicants and awardees still meeting the scholarship requirements are encouraged to re-apply yearly.*)

SELECTION CRITERIA

1. Applicant must be an American Indian, residing in the state of North Carolina for the past twelve (12) months. Applicant must provide proof of American Indian ethnic background as defined below:

An individual who maintains cultural identification as an American Indian through membership in a Native American tribe recognized by the State of North Carolina or the Federal Government.

Guidelines set forth by the federal Indian Education Act, Section 453(a); 20 U.S.C. 122h(a) will also be considered.

2. Applicant must be a *rising sophomore, junior, or senior* with a minimum grade point average of 2.50 on a 4.00 scale and enrolled as a full-time student for the next semester/quarter in one of the 16 schools of the University of North Carolina system. (Appalachian State University, East Carolina University, Elizabeth City State University, Fayetteville State University, North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University, North Carolina Central University, North Carolina School of the Arts, North Carolina State University [at Raleigh], University of North Carolina at Pembroke, University of North Carolina at Asheville, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of North Carolina at Greensboro, University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Western Carolina University, and Winston-Salem State University)
3. Applicant must provide proof of financial need.
4. Applicant must indicate leadership abilities and community involvement.
5. Former scholarship recipients may apply annually for continuation of funding. **Renewal of the award is not automatic.**
6. Former scholarship awardees that re-apply must meet application requirements to be eligible for the scholarship.
7. Only applicants working toward the completion of their first undergraduate degree(s) are eligible for this scholarship.
8. Students transferring from a private, technical, or community college to one of the schools in the U.N.C. System (listed above) are eligible for this scholarship only if they are considered a rising sophomore, junior, or senior by the U.N.C. System school they will attend the following semester or quarter. To verify upcoming attendance at the U.N.C. System school, such transfer students *must include a copy of their letter of acceptance from the U.N.C. System school.*
9. Awardees will be notified by telephone no later than the last Saturday in July and are expected to attend the Triangle Native American Annual Indian Heritage Gala on the third Saturday in August in Raleigh, North Carolina to receive their scholarship money.

APPLICATION PROCESS AND DEADLINES

1. Completed application forms must be postmarked on or before **June 10** of the current year and mailed to:

Applications received later than the due date which are not postmarked June 10 will not be considered.

2. Applications must include *proof of American Indian ethnic background, official post-secondary transcripts, a typed, one-page personal statement, and three formal references.* One reference must be from an instructor at the college or university the student is attending, and two references must be personal references **not** from immediate family members. The applicant must give the reference information forms to each person writing a recommendation for her/him. The applicant should ask the person writing the recommendation to carefully read and follow the instructions on the form. References must be in a sealed envelope with the signature of the person who made the referral **over the seal of the envelope.** Only original references are accepted; copies of references are not accepted.
3. Applications will be reviewed together by the Scholarship and Executives committees of the Society. 8. I have included *one academic reference from one of my college or university instructors* in a sealed, signed envelope.
9. All enclosures, except for proof of my Native American ethnicity, must be *originals*; copies are unacceptable.
10. I am aware that if I am chosen for a scholarship, I will be notified no later than the last Saturday in July and that I am expected to attend the Triangle Native American Society Indian Heritage Gala in Raleigh on the third Saturday in August to receive my award.

2. Response should be **one** 8x11 in. **page in length** and will not be accepted if it exceeds 1.25 pages.
3. Margins must be **1"** all around.
4. Include **your name** and **school** at the top, right-hand corner of the response.
5. Proper academic English, correct spelling, and clear writing should be used when writing your response.
6. Clip, but do not staple, your response to the scholarship packet. (If your response runs over to a second page, staple the two pages together and clip your response to the packet.)
